Thanks for the quick response on the proposed far East Central low-income housing project. I will probably put something in The Chronicle for September outlining the issues as I see them and saying that you're looking into it for us. It will be a concern for our membership. I know that already the homeless and semi-vagrant encounters in the two parking lots at Four Hills and Tramway are a concern for Four Hills residents.

I think that the bottom line question is will this be a long-term revitalization or a further degradation of the area, and I can't see a way that it's a long-term positive. Low-income housing brings with it a host of issues that manifest themselves and then endure long after the grand opening is a distant memory.
