I know that the developers have not been responsive to Michael Horanburg's requests. They've ignored me. I urge you to remain vigilant about the proposed development at 13001 East Central. Perhaps it's necessary for you to get personally involved. The developers may (or may not) feel inclined to respond to a request for information from a sitting City Council member.

I'd also like to know your personal thoughts on this issue when you have a moment, and I think many others are equally interested.
