

Four Hills Village Association Annual Meeting Remarks 2022

The FHVA board has been very busy focusing on a number of important issues this past year.

- 1) Public safety and following up on the Traffic Speeding study recommendations to address speeding and safety issues. In addition, with the assistance and extensive work of Open Space Director Rusty Goetz; an examination of all the road conditions in Four Hills Village. On Sunday November 20th we met with our City Counselor Renee Grout, our State Representative Meredith Dixon, and the Deputy Director of the City Department of Municipal Development in anticipation of Infrastructure funding becoming available in the coming year to address problems with street repairs in FHV.
- 2) Supporting the new Singing Arrow Community Center by encouraging it's usage by FHVA members. The FHVA board has been holding our monthly meetings at the Center. Membership is free and among other things the new center has a workout space equipped with new state of the art machines and free weights. The new center also has a game room equipped with two pool tables and a Foosball table. I urge everyone to stop by the Center and check it out; there is also a remarkably interesting archaeological display uniquely presented in illuminated below the floor sections.
- 3) Working with City Councilor Grout to plan and fund a Multicultural Arts Festival at the new Center and Singing Arrow Park. We want to thank Councilor Grout for arranging a \$20,000 allocation from the City budget to fund this project. We also want to acknowledge City Community Center Directors for their assistance by serving on the planning committee. Much is being planned for this Festival, including Food Trucks, a variety of ethnic performing groups, art and history displays, children's activities, a bouncy house, radio remote and other activities. The planned date for this event is the afternoon of Saturday May 6, 2023.

The goal of the Festival at the park is to support the usage of the new Singing Arrow Community Center and help elevate the image of the East Gateway area which is the entryway to Four Hills Village.

As always, we participated in National Night Out on August 2nd with about seven sites which were all very well attended. The FHVA also sponsored a shredding event on September 17th, publishes the quarterly Chronicle and the Four Hills Village Directory and have done a number of clean-ups of the Open Space area bordering Four Hills Village. The FHVA Yard Sale was held on Saturday May 7th and was extremely successful. Finally, we sponsored a lovely free social event on Sunday October 18th at the Canyon Club and the Annual General Meeting and free breakfast this morning.

As you will see later, we also still have several openings on the FHVA Board.
